## **Talking Points**

- UI. Show us your site's interface. Include wireframes, if you have any.
- Data. Talk us through the data your project might—or will—require for it to work properly.
- How far along are you? Discuss where you are in your project's development cycle.
- What's left? Explain what is left to be implemented.

#### **Format**

There is no predetermined format for you presentations; you can employ whatever tool—digital or otherwise—to present your project.

#### **Duration**

You will have no more than seven minutes—including Q and A—to present, but perhaps a few minutes more during the final project presentation. Budget your time appropriately.
