Your final project progress presentation will take place on 4 March, while the presentation of your final project will take place during either of our last two classes in May. An outline of what you need to discuss on 4 March follows. Note: although the following list is short, you will need to plan, design, and program a great deal in order to address each point clearly.

Talking Points

- **UX.** Discuss what your site's user will—or should—experience.
- **UI.** Show us your site's interface. Include wireframes, if you have any.
- **Data.** Talk us through the data your project might—or will—require for it to work properly.
- **How far along are you?** Discuss where you are in your project's development cycle.
- **What's left?** Explain what is left to be implemented.

Format

There is no predetermined format for your presentations; you can employ whatever tool—digital or otherwise—to present your project.

Duration

You will have no more than seven minutes—including Q and A—to present, but perhaps a few minutes more during the final project presentation. Budget your time appropriately.
